may well be decided, but the weather will be as uncertain as ever.


It has ever been thus.

In 1902 The West Briton and Cornwall Advertiser reported that, '... farmers in the Lostwithiel district commenced harvest last week. Owing to the heavy rains and absence of warmth (sound familiar?) ... Oats have gone down badly and one field on being cut was so bad the work had to be done with the scythe. The self-binder could not be brought to play."

Heavy farm machinery can't be used on sodden soil, as it compresses it even more. If this is a rainy summer and local farmers need help with the

harvest, perhaps it's time to dig out and resharpen the scythes, the reaphooks and sickles from Lostwithiel Museum. An experienced reaper backalong could harvest up to 2 acres of wheat in a day. We can all practice on the grass verge of the A390 to make it more passable and less unkempt, though the bees aren't

complaining.

Weather wise - Monday 15th July is St Swithuns Day. St Swithun was a 9th century bishop, an unusually humble one, as he requested that, on his death, his body be buried outside the Winchester cathedral walls, exposed to the tread of poor human feet. His request was initially granted, but later the authorities bought them within the cathedral grounds. At some point after that, legend has it, there was a terrible and lengthy storm. Locals put two and two together, and the tradition arose that if it rains on 15th of July it will rain for the next 40 days and nights, whereas fine weather on that day will be followed by 40 days of sun. Today we know that the rain

starts the day schools break up and continues until the first week in September when the children all go back into the classrooms.



Natural Summer Fun!

Wether you are a child counting down the days until the summer holidays or an adult stealing every bit of gorgeous sunshine, now is the perfect time to plan some fun outdoor adventures. We thought we would give you a few ideas to spark your creative imagination and get you out into the amazing countryside that surrounds Lostwithiel...

- 1. Create a nature diary. All you need is a notebook or sketch-book something to write or draw with. The aim is to get outside each day for as long as you want, immerse yourself in nature and choose something/s to draw, or write about that day. You could make a photo diary if you prefer, or include physical things you find such as leaves, petals etc. Repeat this as often as you want and you'll end up with a wonderful diary to look back on full of memories of outdoor adventures.
- 2. Scavenger hunt. You can find pre made scavenger hunts online, or you can have fun making your own, you could even get each family member to make a scavenger hunt sheet for another family member. Once you have your lists, head outdoors and explore to find the items you are searching for. You can repeat this so many times, every location and season will have different treasures to find!
- **3. Beach Clean mobiles.** Hopefully the summer allows us lots of opportunities to head to our awesome local beaches. Every time you go to the beach keep an eye out for plastic and any other manmade items littering the beach. Bring home your collection and turn it into a mobile in the garden. I have perviously used a second hand lampshade frame to tie my beach finds onto, but you can also use sticks tied together to make a simple cross frame. You can keep adding to your mobile all summer long to turn trash into something beautiful.





The Rotary Club of Lostwithiel

The Rotary Club of Lostwithiel has been serving our community, and others further afield since 1979.



We tend to forget the impact of inflation on the buying power of the $\mathfrak L$. For example, today we would require $\mathfrak L1.74$ to buy what, in 2007 would have cost $\mathfrak L1$.

To better understand the impact of what we do, our donations since 2007 have been converted to its value today. Using this conversion our donations over that period would amount to £340,000.

Some 30% of this has been to Lostwithiel and the surrounding areas. It includes donations to 95 young people in the form of bursaries or on totally financed personal development courses.

A further 25% has been gifted within Cornwall to organisations like Cornwall Air Ambulance and the hospices.

About 14% has been donated to national causes such as cancer research bodies, the Royal British Legion and Help for Heroes.

So about 70% of our giving is within the UK. The balance goes to international projects like Shelter Box (7.5% providing about 50 Shelter Boxes). Further 7.6% has gone to Rotary Foundation and 6.7% to Rotary End Polio Now campaign. This does not include Trewithen Dairy's Pint for Change, which, supported by the club, raised £40,000 for the eradication of polio.

Arguably one of our most effective projects has been Lend With Care, a Micro Finance scheme. Since 2015 we have helped several hundred small enterprises in the 3rd world, in turn creating 240 new jobs, and helping 1330 family members. When these loans are repaid the same money then goes to new projects. This money is therefore continually being re-invested.

Fowey RNLI

On Saturday 25 May at 1.30pm, Fowey's all-weather lifeboat was launched to assist



with the rescue of a swimmer who had got into difficulty in the sea below Carlyon Bay Hotel, whilst participating in a local swimming event. The Carlyon Bay Lifesaving Club were able to get the swimmer to the nearby beach at Crinnis, which has no direct access and can only be reached from the sea. Teams from St Austell and Mevagissey coastguard had gone down the cliffs by rope to the beach to assist the lifesaving club. The woman was exhausted and was suffering from hypothermia. It was decided that the best way to get the casualty off the beach would be to use the lifeboat. The crew on the all-weather lifeboat launched their small inflatable XP boat, which is carried onboard and got the woman safely onto the lifeboat. They continued to manage her hypothermia, and due to onshore conditions at Charlestown, took her back to Fowey. Here she was given dry clothes and warmed up, before going home with her husband. A good outcome and teamwork by all the rescue services involved. The next day the woman sent a message to the crew: 'Hello! I just wanted to pass on my sincerest thanks to James, Will, Harry and the crew who rescued me from near Charlestown yesterday, when I got into trouble swimming. You were all so kind and truly amazing. So sorry to have interrupted your Saturdays. Thank you.'

On bank holiday Monday 27 May, Fowey's inshore lifeboat was launched at 6.43pm. A 13 year old boy had fallen down a cliff on his bike, on the east side of Spit beach. Due to conditions and reducing visibility the crew on the inshore boat requested back-up from the all-weather lifeboat which was also launched at 7pm. As the inshore lifeboat reached the incident, the local coastguard teams had located the casualty and an ambulance was on scene. Both boats were stood down as no further assistance was required from the lifeboats.



On Sunday 2 June at 6.42pm, Fowey RNLI crew launched their D class inshore lifeboat after the coastguard requested assistance for three paddleboarders. They had been spotted by the NCI and there was concern that two adults and one child appeared to be in difficulty on two paddle boards about a mile off Par beach. There was an offshore wind taking them out and they were struggling to reach the shore. The inshore lifeboat crew located the paddleboarders who had made their way to the shoreline. They confirmed that they had got into difficulty earlier, but were now fine and did not require assistance. The lifeboat

returned to station re-fuelled and made ready for service. Fowey Lifeboat Operations Manager, Chris Ogg said: 'It's important to check weather conditions before going out paddleboarding. Avoid offshore winds because they will tire you quickly when trying to return to shore. Always wear a personal floatation device and a leash and hold onto your board if you get into trouble. Try to choose a lifeguarded beach and always carry a means of calling for help. If you do get into trouble, call 999 and ask for the coastguard.'

On Sunday 9 June at 12:48pm, just as the crew were finishing the debrief from their Sunday morning exercise the pagers went off, requesting that Fowey launch the all-weather lifeboat to assist in a search for a missing diver off the Eddystone Light house. The search was a multi-agency one co-ordinated by Falmouth coastquard, involving Fowey, Plymouth all-weather and inshore 85 lifeboats, Rescue 94 Helicopter and Smit Yare. All but one diver had returned and the orange pick up was not visible. Fowey's lifeboat arrived on site at 1:46pm and was allocated a search leg. Whilst the Fowey crew were commencing their section of the search, Plymouth's 85 crew located the diver who was floating on the water surface. The Plymouth crew rescued the diver and got him and his equipment onboard their all-weather boat. A paramedic from Rescue 94 was winched down onto the Plymouth boat to carry out a full assessment of the casualty, and he was found to be well and required no medical support and was returned to his vessel. The search was stood down at 2:02pm.

Fowey lifeboat week runs from 28 July – 4 August. This is a special year as we commemorate the 200th anniversary of the RNLI and 165 years of Fowey lifeboats. Our team have been working hard to organise some great celebratory events for the week.




