# Sparkling Vintage Ciders

Here's something you might not know - Sparkling wine and cider was being produced in the West Country many years before Dom Perignon (the person the French like to think invented Champagne) was even born. And there's a Lostwithiel connection too!

The champagne bottle with its thick glass, dimple in the bottom, long neck with a ridge at the top to tie the cork down with, was being produced in the west-country from the 1620's (Dom Perignon was born 1638). It came about because the Crown wanted all the oak to build war ships (we were at war with the Dutch) so all the metal and glass furnaces had to use sea coal and oil shale, which they didn't like at first but they found it burnt at a higher temperature and made much stronger glass. Which is exactly what they needed to prevent bottles exploding when they made fine sparkling cider and wine. The chap that held the patent from the crown for the manufacture of these bottles was a certain Sir Robert Mansell who was in 1626 the MP for Lostwithie!

We follow the full Champagne method in the production of our Sparkling Vintage Ciders (we have a Rosé version now too). We firstly ferment our cider for a year, then put it in champagne bottle with more yeast and sugar and seal the bottle with a crown cap. We leave it for at least another year. This creates a secondary fermentation, which builds up to a very high pressure of CO2 but leaves spent yeast in the bottle which has to be removed. So we put the bottles upside down in a frame and turn the bottles a quarter clockwise every day for 10 weeks. This brings the yeast to rest on the cap. We then freeze the cap. We guickly open the bottle, the pressure from the carbon dioxide forces out a small plug of ice with the spent yeast leaving the cider lovely and clear. We top up the bottle and put the champagne cork in with the cage and foil. A great drink for your Easter celebrations and to pair with good food!



By the time this newsletter is printed we will have had our February meeting and will have learnt all about milk from cow to cup from Bill Clarke of Trewithan Dairy.



# **BOOK OF COMMON PRAYER**

### **Fowey RNLI**



This year we are commemorating 165

years of lifesaving at Fowey lifeboat station. Originally based in Polkerris, the station opened in 1859 before moving to Fowey in the 1920s. We're holding the first of our commemorative events on Saturday April 6 which is a Water Safety and RNLI Scroll Signing Day, running from 10am till 3pm at Fowey lifeboat station. There will be lifejacket maintenance sessions which will teach people how to service and check their lifejackets, which all sailors should do at least once a year and is a requirement for all racing boats who sail under World Sailing Special Regulations safety rules.

TMS will be there to support the event with the sale of spare parts for lifejackets, and for those of you who want to have your safety equipment professionally serviced, TMS will provide a facility for you to book in your lifejacket and have it returned to Fowey when complete, to be collected from Fowey Chandlery. We'll be running tours of our all-weather lifeboat from 10am till 2.30pm, and the coastguard team and water safety teams will be there to give demos and advice. The lifeboat shop will be open all day and there will be music and tea/coffee and cakes on sale, plus you'll have the chance to meet Stormy Stan.

A focal point of the day will be the scroll signing. To mark their 200th anniversary, the RNLI are doing an Olympic Torch-style relay called Connecting our Communities, starting on Monday March 4 at the commemorative service in Westminster Abbey, and finishing in the Isle of Man in October. A specially made scroll with the One Crew Pledge will travel around the UK. Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, Hundreds of communities expressed their interest in hosting the scroll, and we are delighted that Fowey lifeboat station has been chosen as one of the host locations. Each station has to chose a representative to sign the scroll on their behalf, so we thought it fitting to chose one of our crew's children to sign it, to represent the future and next generation of Fowey's volunteer RNLI lifesavers. The scroll will be arriving in Fowey on Saturday April 6 and the signing ceremony will take place at 1pm at Fowey lifeboat station. We hope as many people as possible can come along to help us witness and celebrate the occasion. After being signed in Fowey, the scroll will be taken onto our all-weather lifeboat and transported to Mevagissey for a signing ceremony and events on the guay. The lifeboat will launch from Fowey with the scroll at

#### Events on the day will be subject to weather & operational needs.

On Sunday January 28, both Fowey lifeboats were out on their regular training exercises, when they were diverted to their first shout of 2024. A tasking request was received following reports of three people in the water, including one person injured, at Spit beach. Both lifeboats were already in the vicinity and were

requested to attend and assist. When the lifeboats arrived the coastguard team were on scene and the casualties were safely ashore and being attended to. The lifeboats remained on standby until stood down by the coastguard.

Congratulations to Oli Luck and Pete Parry who have both passed out as qualified operational mechanics, trained for duty on Fowey's Trent class all-weather lifeboat. Oli Luck and Pete Parry are both currently inshore lifeboat and all-weather lifeboat (ALB) crew, Pete having served at Fowey RNLI for six years and

Oli with four years service in Fowey.

Commenting on his achievement Oli said: 'Becoming an ALB mechanic has been one of my main aspirations since joining the crew. I have always thought duty mechanic was a highly respected

role and am proud to be part of that team.' Operational mechanics provide cover for the lifeboat. The all-weather lifeboat cannot launch without a duty

mechanic onboard.
As mechanics, they are trained to start and stop the boat, manage emergency procedures and deal with minor defects in the engine operating machinery. While at sea the mechanic is responsible for fire safety and fire emergency procedures, rectifying

minor mechanical problems

and ensuring that equipment is running safely. Fowey lifeboat Coxswain, Jonathan Pritchard said: 'The mechanic is an important role on a lifeboat, as with any large ship, it can't go to sea without a mechanic onboard. Oli and Pete have worked hard and applied themselves very well in training. They received some instruction at the RNLI college in Poole and a lot of practical training, experience and shadowing of other mechanics during our regular training exercises on the all-weather lifeboat. Congratulations to both of them on their achievement.'

When Luke Grace was diagnosed with MS in 2018 and had to give up his job, he decided to fulfil a dream of his to build model boats. This January he completed an amazing working model of Fowey's all-weather Trent class lifeboat. Luke grew

up in Tywardreath and went to Fowey school where he used to love going down to the harbour to look at the lifeboat. Luke said: 'I have a passion for boats especially the Trent class and Severn class. It has been a dream of mine to build a model of the

Fowey lifeboat, the Maurice and Joyce Hardy, so I started to build her about a year and a half ago.' Visitors will be able to see Luke's model this August, when it will be part of a display at the Fowey RNLI Lifeboat Exhibition, which will run from August 1 – 4 in Fowey Town Hall.

A Service of Thanksgiving to mark 200 years of the RNLI will be held in Westminster Abbey on Monday 4 March 2024. Since being founded in 1824 the charity's lifeboat crews and lifeguards have saved over 144,000 lives. The service will mark this major milestone, with a congregation made up of representatives from RNLI lifesaving communities around the UK and Ireland,

including representatives from Fowey

Members of the Fowey History Group are interviewing local people about their memories of Fowey lifeboats, and we're also interested in any old photos or memorabillia connected to Fowey lifeboats for display in our exhibition in August.
