



Lostwithiel Area Labour

Our South West Conference was a very exciting event due in part to the fact that for the first time our region has twenty four Labour MPs, many of whom were in attendance and keen to highlight the many achievements of the new government.

From two million extra NHS appointments delivered, to a new NHS 24/7 helpline for mental health, domestic abuse advisors in every 999 call centre and a new dental drop- in clinic in Plymouth, the change is happening, even if we don't get to hear about it from our many Tory owned newspapers.

For those of you who have ever stood in a pub and sung the line from Harry's Song for Cornwall, 'Let's hear it for the miners who we hope will mine again,' there's good news; they will!

Labour's National Wealth Fund has invested £28 million in South Crofty to kick start the impressive task of bringing the mine back into the production of tin and lithium, both materials essential in the manufacture of all high-tech devices. Unlike most mining activity, this project will not damage the environment and will reduce the need for expensive imports from countries with poor environmental standards.

Will Keating's lovely folk song, 'South Crofty', describes just how important this project is to the people of Camborne and the whole of Cornwall.

The high skilled, well paid jobs which this initiative will create are just the first of many which will also flow from the development of Cornwall's unique position at the heart of Labour's sustainable energy generation plans and GB Energy, our publicly owned, clean energy company.

Devolution of powers from Westminster to Cornwall is a vitally important issue which is currently under discussion.

Our MP, Anna Gelderd, is keen to hear as many views as possible on the devolution options being discussed for Cornwall. Although this is a local government issue, so will not be decided by Cornwall's MPs, they are all keen to promote the option they believe will serve their constituents best. Anna believes that any deal must respect our unique identity and heritage while providing us with the resources and powers we need.



Brian Oldham who transported us back to the Victorian era and the Trades and Occupations in 19th Century Liskeard. The town expanded rapidly during the Caradon copper boom and became an important business centre in east Cornwall and we heard about chandlers, blacksmiths, umbrella makers and tanners - as well as the many miners - plying their trades. We were also grateful to members of the Lostwithiel Bowling Club who told us about the history of the club in Restormel Road (they will celebrate their centenary in 2026) and their recent successes, as well as looking ahead to the forthcoming season.

Our next Open Meeting is on Monday 12th May at 2pm in the Church Rooms, Lostwithiel. Plus, in our Community Slot, Karen Gledhill will be giving us the latest on South East Cornwall Arts.



Fowey RNLI

On Monday 3 March at 4:29pm the coastguard requested Fowey crew launch to locate and



assess a 24' Cornish Crabber with engine failure that had broken down 0.4Nm off Pencarrow Head, with no wind. Fowey's volunteer crew launched the lifeboat at 4:40pm. As the lifeboat was leaving Fowey Harbour the people onboard the boat confirmed they had managed to start the engine but still had issues with it. A lifeboat crew member was put on board to assist the boat, and the lifeboat escorted the boat to the pontoon, where the awaiting shore crew assisted with mooring of the boat.
