



South East Cornwall Constituency Labour Party

During the budget it was good to hear the Chancellor mention Cornwall by name when she announced a £30 million investment into the Kernow Industrial Growth Fund which will support developments in clean energy, critical minerals and marine industries.

In South East Cornwall more than 1,500 children are in households stricken by poverty which is exacerbated by the two child benefit cap; so it was vital that the Chancellor cancelled this cruel policy to ensure that all children have the best chance to thrive. In 60% of these families at least one parent is working, so the rise in the minimum wage will also help to alleviate poverty in our

Thanks to lobbying by our Cornish MPs, the government has modified its plans for Inheritance Tax on farms to allow the £1 million allowance for 100% rate of agricultural property relief and business property relief to be transferable between spouses and civil partners.

In November our MP, Anna Gelderd, was in Lostwithiel for the Remembrance Sunday service followed by wreath laying at the memorial. Undeterred by the torrential rain, Lostwithiel turned out in great numbers to remember with gratitude the men and women of our armed forces and their families.

New veterans support centres are to be opened around the country to give much needed support with health, housing and jobs. A few weeks ago Anna attended a fascinating conference, led by Joy Bassett of Cornwall Gateway CIC, to explore their ambitious plans for a Food Processing/ Agri-Food and Drink Resource Centre in Bodmin. Amongst many other initiatives, this centre would provide shared bottling, canning, labelling and storage facilities for our amazing Cornish food and drink producers. A quick google search will enable you to read about all aspects of this project. Anna was impressed by the potential benefits to the farmers and growers of South East Cornwall, as well as the potential for quality, year- round jobs and training opportunities for our young people. Following this, Anna made a quick visit to excellent Lostwithiel businesses, Penhaligons and Bella Mama, before moving on to Cornwall Orchards at Duloe to follow up on their visit by the Chancellor earlier in the summer.

Cornish renters will soon benefit from the Renters Rights Bill. Among other things, the bill will outlaw no fault evictions, stipulate that tenants can be asked to pay no more than one month's rent up front and make it possible for beloved family pets to accompany their owners into rental properties.

There is good news regarding more high quality jobs in South East Cornwall, with Plymouth having been allocated a significant amount of funding to develop its defence industries and services. NHS dental services collapsed under the Tories, resulting in many people literally having no access to dental care and tooth extraction shockingly becoming the number one cause of children being admitted to hospital. This Labour government is committed to rebuilding dentistry and it is good to hear that, in the first instance, the dire situation for children will be addressed with a new, mobile NHS dental service.

This is just a start; a full dental service will take longer to be rebuilt. Fourteen years of Tory neglect and decline cannot be turned around in a year, or even one parliament, and parties offering simple solutions are not being honest with the public. A 'decade of renewal' will be required to restore our public services to the healthy state they were in in 2010.

Recently, members gathered for a lovely cream tea at the brilliant Community Kitchen in Saltash, where an affordable lunch is provided three days a week for anyone who needs it. On Wednesday 5th November Anna's 'pop up' office made its second visit to the post office room at Lostwithiel Community Centre. Two caseworkers were in attendance all morning to speak to constituents and offer whatever help and support our MP's office is able to provide. In order to ensure privacy and focused attention, it is best to make an appointment in advance via annagelderdmp.com These pop ups are in addition to Anna's own in-person surgeries, appointments for which must be booked in advance, via her website. The website is a brilliant source of information about all aspects of Anna's work.

Fowey RNLI

After a busy summer season, things have been much quieter lately as boats come



out of the water at the end of the season. That hasn't stopped our crew though, who are continuing to train on Tuesdays and Sundays throughout the winter on our D class and relief Atlantic 85 lifeboats. Our brand new Atlantic 85 is currently in production at the RNLI's Inshore Lifeboat Centre (ILC), based in East Cowes on the Isle of Wight. The Atlantic 85s are built almost completely at the ILC by a team of up to 70 highly skilled boatbuilders, fitters, electricians and solutionists who build and maintain up to 80 boats each year. This includes inflatable B class and D class lifeboats, and lifeguards' inshore rescue boats. There's a dedicated laminating shop, spray booth, machine shop and welding bay, specifically for the creation of the Atlantic 85 lifeboats. The hull and deck and console mouldings for our boat will be made here, with the hull cooked in an oven and then fitted out with hull structure, decks, fuel tanks and ballast systems. Once completed our new lifeboat will be tested and trialled at sea and then delivered to Fowey lifeboat station, where a naming ceremony and blessing will take place next year.

Rotary Club of Lostwithiel

End Polio Now.

The club has always been active in this project. We have learned in recent years that viruses don't respect borders and Polio is no exception. Across our District, Rotary Clubs are encouraged to



help walk a cumulative total of 1240 miles- the length of the border between Afghanistan and Pakistan. These are the last two polio-endemic countries. Lostwithiel Rotary Club pledged to walk a share of these miles and set itself a second goal of raising £1240 for the End Polio Now campaign. Two of our members, Karen Ross and Kath Townsend organised a walk from Lostwithiel Community Centre to Restormel Castle and back and were accompanied by several other members. This, in tandem with an event held earlier, has raised over £1,100 so just short of our target.

Thanks to the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, every pound raised by Rotarians becomes $\mathfrak L3$. In addition, Lostwithiel Rotary set up a JustGiving page with the Rotary Foundation of the UK as the beneficiary. They were mainly from Cornwall and Devon, but we attracted one from Gloucester and one from London. What was very encouraging was that 40 from Lostwithiel took part.

At 10.30 am the hooter was blown and away they went, all 190 of them. The route took them along Restormel Road, up the hill to a circuit of Restormel Castle Car Park, then past Duchy of Cornwall Offices and up the valley to the Water Treatment Works. After a "turn around" in the field just beyond the water works, they got back to the tarmac and returned to the beginning. First across the line was James Brydon of St. Austell Running Club in a time of just over 24 minutes. First lady home was Abi McEwan from the same club. Some runners had entered a run for the first time, including the final one across the line. He normally attends events to support his wife, who is a runner, but this time he decided to give it a go. He finished in a creditable 1hour 9 minutes, but this would have

been improved had he not stopped to chat to the pink Unicorn (Lisa Prior Richards) in the Castle Car Park.

Marshals at the event were Rotarians and local volunteers. Well done to everyone who took partorganisers, runners and marshals alike. Runners paid and entry fee and a



total of £2200 profit was raised for Rotary

Charity.

The Club has committed to hold the event again in 2026 so watch this space for the date. We hope that we might attract over 50 locals next time round and to increase the total entry

Santas on Bikes.

On Saturdy 6th. December 2025 the Santas on Bikes run will pass through Lostwithiel on A390, at about 2pm. Every year this great group of bike enthusiasts, about 200 of them, dressed as Santas, do this trip for charity. Their charity this year is Children's Hospice South West, and their route ends at Little Harbour House,

St. Austell. Our club is very supportive of their aims and to help them raise a decent amount. members of Lostwithiel Rotary Club will be along the route through town with collecting buckets. All donations will go to the Bikers. If you can, please give generously. This is not a Rotary event, but we are pleased to help them with their fundraising efforts.

Rotary Turned £2500 Into £18,000 Supporting 500 Entrepreneurs Lostwithiel Rotary's microfinance project celebrates 10 years of changing lives around the world.

What started as a £2,500 investment by the Rotary Club of Lost-withiel has grown into a global success story. Over the past decade, that modest fund has been continuously re-invested through microfinance loans - supporting 500 entrepreneurs in developing countries, lending £18,181helping to create 379 new jobs and improving the lives of 1480 family members.

And it continues to work- giving people work. It is a powerful example of how Rotary's spirit of service and innovation can multiply impact many times over.

Lending With Care.

The Rotary Club of Lostwithiel is well known locally for its fundraising and community projects, but like clubs everywhere its vision extends far beyond Cornwall Through its initiatives such as End Polio Now, ShelterBox, and the Rotary Overseas Project, which delivered ambulances and fire engines to Eastern Europe, Rotary members help communities worldwide.

In 2015 Lostwithiel Rotary Club decided to find a new way to ensure that its international aid reached those who needed it most. We invested £1,000- soon increased to £2,500 - in Lendwithcare, a microfinance scheme run by CARE International. This initiative allows individuals and organisations to lend small amounts of money directly to entrepreneurs in developing countries, helping them to build sustainable livelihoods.

Microfinance- Empowering People With Dignity

Microfinance gives people the tools to work their way out of poverty with dignity. Borrowers use the funds to grow small businesses such as farms, shops, cafes, tailoring and taxi services and repay the loans over time. Once the money is repaid it can be lent again and again, multiplying its positive impact.

From Benin To The Phillipines

The club's first loan in 2015 helped Delphine and her family in Benin to expand their farming business and begin building a house. Ten years later we reached our sooth loan, to Glenda of Cebu, the Phillipines, who borrowed £707 (including a contribution from Lostwithiel Rotary) to buy stock for her general store. She is



the main breadwinner for her family and her re-payments will soon help the next entrepreneur's dream

To date the club's loans, all from the original £2,500 repaid and loaned over and over again, have reached people in Vietnam, Ecuador, Pakistan, Thailand, Togo and beyond, supporting small enterprises. Although there are small administrative costs the real power of microfinance lies in sustainability. Every re-payment becomes a new opportunity- turning the same funds into fresh starts for hundreds of families. From a £2,500 idea to more than £18,000 in life changing loans, Lostwithiel Rotary's microfinance project shows how small actions can create ripples of hope around the world.



Lostwithiel Environment Action Forum

As the year draws to a close we have been reflecting on all that we have achieved this year as Lostwithiel's Environmental Action Forum. Our Repair Cafe is well established



now, trees we have planted locally are growing nicely and we have had several great events full of conversation and community building! Another very key project this year has been our application for Designated Bathing Water Status for the River Fowey in Lostwithiel. This has been a collaborative project with between LEAF and several members of the Lostwithiel Outdoor Swimmers group. Completing the application process has been a mammoth task, but we are very pleased that we did successfully submit our application in time for the deadline of 31st October 2025.

We now have to patiently await the decision from DEFRA. Between now and February 2026, DEFRA have the opportunity to come back to us with any specific questions related to our application. Following this DEFRA will launch a public consultation at some point between February and March 2026. We will then discover if our application has been successful by 15th May 2026.

So, it is very much a waiting game! But whilst we wait, we would like to extend a huge thank you to the wonderful local community, local businesses and both Lostwithiel Town Council and Cornwall Council. Without the support of all of these people, our application would not have been possible.

The outpouring of support from local residents, regular visitors and holiday makers in the town has been so encouraging. The number of stories, memories and beautiful words that have been shared with us about the river and its importance in all of our lives has been truly lovely. We are so lucky to have this natural asset running through the middle of our town, and long may it continue to be a place where memories are made and our mental and physical health is boosted.



Not only is the river an important asset to us human residents, its also a haven for wildlife, and protecting the health of the river for all its inhabitants is paramount to LEAF, and this has really been the driving force behind our campaign.

We received many letters of support from local businesses, organisations and clubs. Each of these recognised the wider benefits that the river and its health brings to the town. As people come to the riverside to enjoy a paddle or a swim, they inevitably enjoy the other great things our town has to offer from delicious food and drinks to unique shops and interesting historical buildings and tales. A key part of our application process was gaining the support of the landowner, in our case Lostwithiel Town Council. After some initial concerns raised by the Town Council we are pleased to say we have gained their support for this application. We also needed support from Cornwall Council. This became a pretty difficult task due to concerns held by the Council but we did eventually succeed! We received an excellent letter of support from our County Councillor Sarah Preece, as well as our MP Anna Gelderd, both stated the importance of projects such as Designated Bathing Waters.

We will of course update you all as soon as we hear any news from DFFRA.

Start Christmas With Carols Around Town – Lostwithiel Christmas Pageant

Saturday 13th December is the date for this year's Lostwithiel Christmas Pageant – with Carols accompanied by the Town Band, a Nativity Tableau and this year a performance by Lostwithiel's Kana Choir before the Pageant sets out on its walk around Town.

Old and young are invited to gather at the Church Rooms at 3.30pm, where the tableau of costumed Nativity characters will assemble, the choir will sing, and then the procession, accompanied by the Town Band, will set off at 4.15pm.

Small Shepherds and Angels (fairy wings?) are always especially welcome to dress up and come along – with Mum or Dad of course. There is usually a baby lamb, too, carried by a grown-up Shepherd. By tradition, a new Mary and Joseph are found each year for the centre of the tableau.

The route takes in Fore Street, Quay Street Lime Kilns, Monmouth Square, the Scout Hut, Bridgend Peace Memorial, and finishes on the Mediaeval Bridge. At each stop a traditional Christmas Carol is sung, with songsheets for all to join in. At some point there is mulled wine or apple juice to warm the singers.

This Lostwithiel Christmas tradition dates back to the early 1980s, when it was devised and organised by Rachel John, the late Cornish historian and Lostwithiel resident. Costumes and characters may be slightly amended over the years, but on a winter's evening, gathered in the open air to sing the old familiar songs, it retains its magic, as well as its very informal community atmosphere.
