



Lovely Yoga Cornwall is based in Lostwithiel and I have been teaching movement classes to all ages and abilities for over thirty years. Many people ask me questions about what I do... "what is somatics"... "what does a chair yoga class involve"...."can I do yoga if I feel a bit stiff"..."I need to manage my stress and learn to relax, can yoga help" ... So this summer I am offering free try out passes so interested people can come and see for themselves. Fulfill your curiosity, befriend your body and come and enjoy a class for free... you won't regret it. All the props and mats are provided and I am fully insured with a current First Aid Certificate and up-to-date DBS.

We have a lovely, fully equipped light and airy studio at the back of Lostwithiel Community Centre and I offer classes in the mornings and evenings and I am available to run one to one and / or small private group sessions and I also teach on retreats and run bespoke training days and workshops.

Here's a little bit of info about what I do...and what's on offer with

your free try-out.

Step & Strengthen classes, which include hand weights and kettlebells, are lots of fun and suited to those who are looking for an energising and energetic workout to burn calories, tone up and strengthen their core, legs and arms. Every class ends with a delicious stretch down. The Reebok steps, weights and kettle bells are provided, you will need to wear trainers and bring a water bottle.

Somatic Movement Therapy is a very powerful, strengthening and soothing class where we release and ease out painful areas and joint spaces around the body. We then reconnect and strengthen tired muscles and movement zones leaving you feeling really calm, rested and revitalised. These classes are extremely popular and have helped hundreds of people recuperate and recover from chronic pain, physical injury and support the recovery from emotional and psychological trauma. Emma is a trauma-informed practitioner with lots of training and personal experience in this area.

Soma Flow Yoga is a combination of somatic movement, yoga sequences and poses, qi-gong, mindfulness and meditation. These classes are designed to strengthen and energise the body, quieten the mind, release trapped emotional energy and rejuvenate the spirit.

We explore lying, seated and standing postures and sequences combined with a range of stretches, restorative postures using props and bolsters and we always enjoy a guided meditation or relaxation at the end.

#### Chair Yoga and Seated Somatics

These popular, seated and standing classes are enjoyed by those who have painful knees, hips or low back issues which stop them from moving up and down from the floor easily. In these sessions we mobilise, strengthen and release all the major muscles and joint spaces of the body and loosen the spine with side bends, twists, forward and back bending. We also focus on improving our breathing and posture and all of the props and yoga chairs are provided.

#### **Fowey RNLI**

On Wednesday 30 April Falmouth Coastguard requested an immediate launch of Fowey's



inshore lifeboat. There had been reports of a child in the water off Whitehouse in Fowey Harbour. Fowey's volunteer crew launched the lifeboat at 6:37pm and went straight to the scene. On arrival they established that the casualty had entered the water following an altercation and that a friend had followed the casualty into the water. Both persons were safely on the shore, but concerns were raised that the casualty would try and enter the water again. Fowey's crew provided casualty care and warm clothes and having ensured that the casualty was being cared for by her family, the lifeboat crew, police and coastguard team stood down.





Congratulations to Callum Pritchard (left) and Kai A'Lee(right) who successfully passed out as qualified lifeboat navigators at Fowey lifeboat station this May. The lifeboat navigator qualification required Callum and Kai to demonstrate high standards of navigational skill. They are now trained in the use of navigational charts, radar, AIS, GPS, bouyage, passage planning, search patterns and knowledge of local waters. Callum, who is the son of Fowey lifeboat station's coxswain, Jonathan Pritchard, said: 'It's a great achievement and for me, a stepping stone to follow in dad's footsteps as a station coxswain.' Kai commented: 'I'm very happy to have passed my Nav. I will continue to develop my skills and am excited to apply them to helping people. Thank you to all the crew and assessors that helped with my training and for the advice that was given.' Fowey Coxswain Jonathan Pritchard said: 'Congratulations to Callum and Kai for successfully passing out. They have both worked hard to achieve this and have shown great commitment to their training programmes. Congratulations from all at the station.

Our lifeboat tours are up and running and you can visit on Wednesdays and Saturdays. Our lifeboat will be leaving Fowey for good later this year, so grab your chance to have a good look round her and take your final photos before she leaves. No booking is needed, just turn up on the day. Tours from 10.30am – 3pm, weather and operational issues permitting.

Our shop is also now open, filled with lots of interesting lifeboat goodies, gifts, clothing and toys.





## **Rotary Club** of Lostwithiel

Rotary and international compassion! Lesotho, Cornwall, WW2





Because it was Rotary, Lostwithiel Rotary was able to more than double that amount by attracting more funds to help Rotary in Lesotho refurbish the country's only cancer clinic. The clinic is the Sankantana Oncology Clinic, the aim is to treat cancer locally, to help avoid very costly referrals to other countries. But the flow of donations is not one way!

There are other local connections; Lesotho is one of the heroes of WW2. In 1940 Britain was on the brink of invasion. At this critical time, Basutoland, as it was called then, helped us! They presented 24 Spitfire fighter aircraft to the UK, sufficient to equip two RAF squadrons. In 2016, to celebrate this incredibly generous contribution, the Spitfire Heritage Trust donated a full-size replica Spitfire to Lesotho.

The Cornwall link? The replica Spitfire now standing in Makoanyane Square in the capital city of Maseru was made at Withiel, less than 10 miles from Lostwithiel. In 2018 a lady from Lesotho donated a tapestry woven by a women's cooperative in Lesotho to raise funds for Children's Hospice SW. That raised about £1,500, from a country that has very high child mortality, helping our youngsters! A true example of international compassion.

Another international project supported by Lostwithiel Rotary Club is Lend with Care. It is aimed at providing entrepreneurs in less fortunate parts of the world with some assistance in setting up a business. At present we have loaned £17,671 in relatively small amounts to some 471 people. The loans have permitted someone to set up in business and so support their own family. In many cases they have been able to create employment where none previously existed. All this in impoverished countries giving hope and employment in much needed circumstances. When the loans are repaid, the money is lent out again, creating more opportunity for good.

On a more local basis, the club is still helping organisations, charities and individuals achieve their aims and objectives with grants such as student bursaries, local and national charities, plus of course our members' involvement in our own Carnival Week and much more.
