Councillor Sarah Preece Lostwithiel Letters

We've had the kind of turbulent start to 2026 no-one could have predicted. With Storm Goretti and Storm Ingrid, weather events have impacted residents, making it a difficult few weeks for all.

The impact of flooding, the cuts to power, water and internet and the devastating loss of so many of our wonderful trees, flora and fauna across the Duchy highlights the ferocity of extreme weather events and the impact of their increasing number. A multi-agency review is underway to assess the implications to ensure the learning is embedded into any future crisis response and I and our local town and parish councils are feeding into that for our residents.

Looking to the year ahead starts really with a look back to what was achieved in 2025.

A meeting in December with Ministers, led to confirmation that Homes England are willing to further develop their partnership with Cornwall Council to deliver more affordable housing.

The news at the end of the year from government was that Cornwall will receive a bespoke devolution deal that recognises our national minority status. Becoming a Foundational Strategic Authority will put Cornwall on an equal footing with the mayoral authorities and pave the way for greater decision-making powers tailored to Cornwall.

Progress was made to secure formal recognition of Cornwall's Celtic language – Kernewek - under Part III of the European Charter for Regional or Minority Language. Having initially been protected under Part II of the Charter since 2002, the intervening 24 years has seen a resurgence of the use of Kernewek in everyday life.

This official recognition is the culmination of many years of work by Cornwall Council, MPs, community groups and cultural organisations to ensure the language plays a key role in life in Cornwall and creates parity with other Celtic languages across the British Isles.

Our status as a strategic authority was also recognised in the November budget with the announcement of £30m of Kernow Industrial Growth Funding which will help give us some continuity for economic growth. Despite the funds being a fraction of the allocations made to the mayoral authorities, Cornwall Council is the only non-mayoral authority to be given either a locally-led 'Growth Fund' or the powers to retain 100 percent business rates.

While income from business rates helps Cornwall deliver local economic growth, the council is lobbying government about the proposed changes, which, if implemented, will have a devastating impact on businesses across Cornwall. We will also keep fighting for fairer funding for Cornwall as the funding settlement has left the council with £54m less funds and slashed structural investment funding.

More locally, meetings with community partners to discuss A38 and A30 safety and campaigning to scrap the Tamar Crossing Tolls continue as key priorities for cabinet.

Meanwhile, I have been working with key stakeholders to secure the future of Newquay Zoo and am leading a sector response to the liquidation of Visit Cornwall with a sector summit at the end of January. The Summit will bring together key leads in Cornwall's hospitality sector to help secure the future of this critical part of the Cornish economy.

Bursaries
