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## Fowey RNLI

On Sunday 26 July, the day after her official naming ceremony, Fowey's Atlantic 85, Spirit of Daisy, was

tasked by Falmouth Coastguard to launch after receiving a report of a paddleboard being blown offshore with no-one onboard near Pentewan. It was not certain whether anyone had been on it. Fowey's D Class lifeboat which was at a PR event at Charlestown Regatta was also tasked to attend. The D Class was first to arrive on scene and they commenced a search of the coastline. They didn't find anything and so after discussion with the coastguard they were advised that the person who called the coastguard after spotting the paddleboard was at the nearby sailing club. The lifeboat crew went to the sailing club and the informant pointed out to them the general direction of the sighting of the paddleboard approx 1 1/2 miles off shore. They proceeded to that position and were joined by the Atlantic 85 in a wider search of the area towards Mevagissey and the mussel farm before heading back to Pentewan for another coastline search. Nothing was found and the coastguard confirmed that no-one had been reported missing, so both lifeboats were stood down, returning to the station at 6:30pm.

On Saturday 15 August, Fowey RNLI were tasked at 3:25pm to launch both their D Class and Atlantic 85 lifeboats to assist four casualties on three paddleboards off Lantivet Bay to the east of Fowey. Two of the boards were around one mile offshore and were struggling to get back to the beach in a gusty northerly wind. Fowey's volunteer crew launched their Atlantic 85 lifeboat first at 3:37pm and arrived on scene to the two offshore casualties at 3:45pm. The crew then towed the casualties safely back to the beach. The crew launched their D class lifeboat at 3:42pm and arrived at the location of the other two casualties at 3:55pm. The two people were on one paddleboard and by this time, these two casualties were safely close to the beach and did not require any assistance.

On Sunday 16 August at 4:19pm Falmouth Coastguard requested the launch of Fowey's D Class inshore lifeboat to assist with



recovering a 35yr old female with a suspected back injury. The injury happened on Lantic Beach, which has very steep access, meaning that attending crews could not safely get her off the beach by land. Fowey's crew launched their D class lifeboat at 4:35pm and arrived on scene at 4:43pm. Polruan Coastguard team were already in attendance, and the lifeboat crew assisted with casualty care and discussed options for getting the casualty to safety. South West ambulance crew then arrived at the scene and took over the casualty care. Due to her injuries it was decided that the best option was to transport the casualty by lifeboat to the Pilot pontoon in Fowey, and then onwards via ambulance to Treliske Hospital. The lifeboat crew left the scene with the casualty onboard at 6:40pm and proceeded at a slow speed to Fowey. There the casualty was handed over to the awaiting ambulance service at 7:18pm.

Our boathouse is open to visitors and people have been enjoying having a close look at Fowey's D Class and Atlantic 85 lifeboats and getting some great photo opportunities. Come along and find out all about the work of the RNLI, what it's like to be a crew member and read up on the lifeboats' latest 'shouts'. Opening times: Monday, Wednesday & Saturday 11am – 3pm.

## My Earliest Memories. By Warren Nicholls age 91 and 3 months.

There are so many memories that I have, that if I do not write some down, they will be forgotten. Little things that perhaps no one else knew or saw. We have given talks in the Church Rooms, which were well attended, but missed out small things. We recently had lunch in a restaurant in Fore St and the two men serving had no idea there was a cinema in South street, or that a wooden rail line came down from the Iron Mine, through the fields through Monmouth Lane down to the quay.

I was born in Grenville Road, the closest house to the station, My father Harry Nicholls was a Monument Mason, member of the bowling chub, my mother Gwen Nicholls was a member of the WI, the Choral Society, Nursing Association and regularly played the Wesley Chapel organ.

When I was about two, having seen my Dad thumping granite, I got a small hammer, and broke off the edges of the tiles of the fire place. One Sunday morning whilst we three were still in bed, my Dad said there is an Elephant crossing the bridge. There was a circus on the move, and it stopped to drink from the Peace Memorial in Trafalgar Square, before going on to the circus field at Lanwithan.

I was pushed up Mill Hill, to see the steamrollers working on the Bypass, Liddicoat Road, it was about finished in 37/38. The houses of Walkhams Row had been demolished, before Mill Hill was closed to traffic. This meant that all through traffic would no longer need to come down North St, over the bridge and up Grenville Road.

School came all too quickly, I started in the September term 1939, so did lots of others still around the area today. The beginners went into Miss Mays class, I cannot imagine how old she was as she had taught my mother at Carclaze many years before. It only took a few minutes before I decided this was not for me, and ran across the yard, only to meet my mother who was still there. I was marched back!!

From our gate to the station there was a stone hedge. It was there one morning going to school but was partly removed by home time, and replaced by the block wall that is still there.

The War was on the way.

Very soon lorries were bringing aggregate and making a road in Lanwithan Moor. A steamroller was parked at the end of one line and during the night shunting trucks over shot and crashed into the steamroller man's green trailer, killing the driver.

The road continued and an extra rail line was laid starting from the Iron Bridge. This came into use when the Americans arrived.

The remainder of the siding were used for the China clay trains, and other storage. The Fowey Train continued to carry its regular passengers, and buses went from Bodmin to Lerryn.
